The children have really enjoyed learning their phonics sounds in our daily Little Wandle phonics sessions and experimenting with the new sounds in lots of fun ways, such as fishing for letters in our water trays and painting phonics sounds at our creative table. The children

particularly enjoyed their parents coming into school to watch a phonics session, so thank you to those who could attend. The children often come into school telling us all about doing their homework and it is evident that they've been practising their phonics sounds and letter formation



at home. When we share the children's reading books with them in school, they love to tell us all about their reading book and who they have read with at home. The way that the children's reading and writing is coming along is superb, so thank you for encouraging your children's learning at home by completing homework and sharing your child's reading book with them. Our first topic was 'Autumn'. We learnt all about seasonal changes and we went on an autumn walk



to see what we could find. The children loved exploring the school grounds and collecting leaves and twigs to stick on their strips of paper. In maths we made cross-curricular links and we compared the sizes of different autumnal objects, such as

pumpkins, sticks, pine cones and leaves. As part of our expressive arts curriculum we made clay hedgehogs - we think they looked great!





After the half term a lot of our learning has been based around autumn and winter festivals. Straight after the half term we learnt about Bonfire Night, learning about how and why we celebrate it. We learnt about Guy Fawkes and we made fireworks pictures on our classroom interactive smartboards. Our next theme was Diwali and

we learnt about how Hindus celebrate the festival. We were lucky enough to have a talk from Mrs Deo who talked to us all about Diwali. After our talk from Mrs Deo we made Diwali cards, created Diwali dances in the outdoor area, made Diva pots out of clay and we looked at non-fiction Diwali books from our story shelves.





A highlight of the term was writing letters to Father Christmas. We enjoyed posting them in the post box and we are waiting patiently for a reply! We have learnt all about the Nativity story and how Christians celebrate Christmas. We have also compared how we celebrate Christmas in the UK to the rest of the world. When we made these comparisons, we looked at a world map and where different countries are in the world. We hope Father Christmas can manage to visit all the countries in one night! When we learnt about Christmas we also visited our local church to learn about the nativity story. We discussed how Christmas is in the season of winter and we enjoyed a winter walk around school comparing similarities and differences to our autumn walk.

It really has been a great term for all of us in Reception. We would like to thank all of the fantastic teaching assistants, students and volunteers who have worked so hard alongside us to help the children settle in and to support them with their work. And finally, we would all like to thank you too for all of your help and support. We hope you all have a wonderful Christmas holiday and we look forward to hearing all about what the children have been doing when we see them again in the New Year.
