The children have really enjoyed our 'growing' topic linked to the story 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. There has been lots of discussion about what plants need to grow and the best conditions for them. Hopefully their beanstalks are all growing well at home! Another highlight for us has been having our living caterpillars in school. The children have absolutely loved watching the caterpillars grow, build their cocoons and then emerge as butterflies before releasing them.

The children had a fantastic morning on Sports Day. They all thoroughly enjoyed taking part in all the different events and were very proud to show you how well they did. 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We also had a fantastic time on our school trip to Sacrewell Farm. In Maths we've been busy with our adding and subtracting, doubling and halving and shape work. During our daily number sessions, we have also been spending lots of time practising our odd and even numbers, number bonds to 10 and applying all of our different maths skills. It's been fantastic to see how much progress the children have made during the year and how much pride they take in their Maths work. All of the children should be very proud of themselves.
