Safeguarding

Under the Education Act 2002 (section 175), schools must “make arrangements to safeguard and promote the welfare of children”.

Geography, History, P.E, R.E, Music, Computing, Art, French, DT, Outdoor Learning and PSHE.

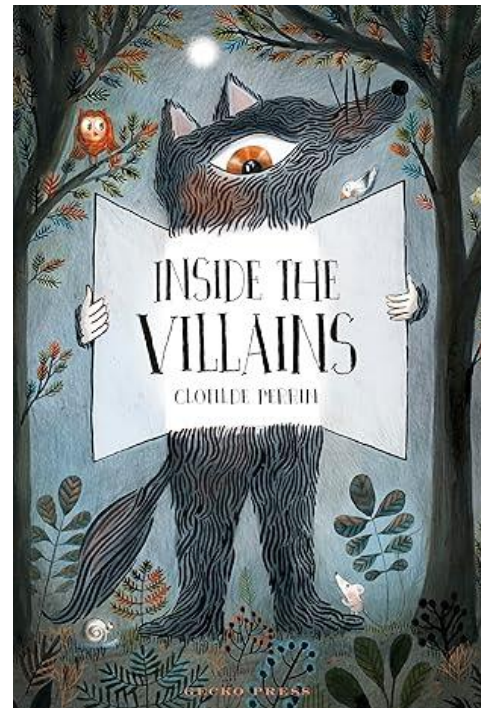
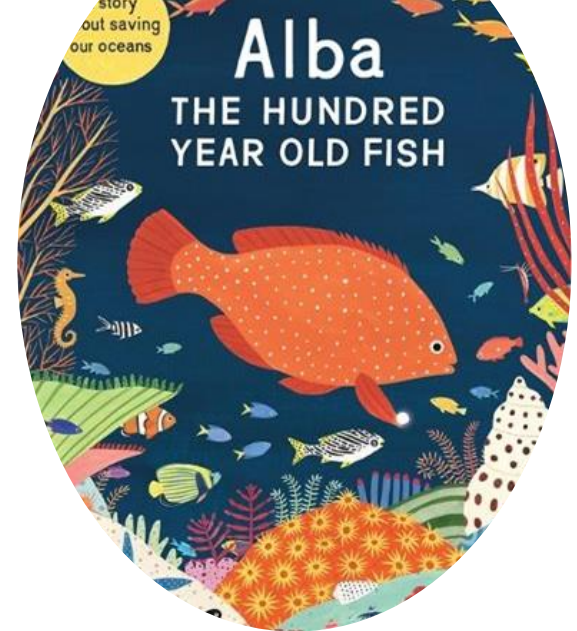


This Term English

- At the start of this term, we will explore the book 'The Villains' by Clotilde Perrin. Whilst exploring this book, we will be looking at the role of the wolf in a variety of traditional tales. The children will then engage in a range of different activities such as exploring contrasting stories involving a wolf, character descriptions, 'WANTED' posters and a class debate.

- We will also be looking forward to reading and using some exciting books. 'Alba The Hundred Year Old Fish' based on our 'Planet Protectors' Geography Topic. Throughout the year, we will be looking at a variety of text types both fiction and non-fiction, extending our understanding of their specific structural and language features.

- We are continuing to focus on our children's love of reading and their comprehension skills as well as developing and extending their understanding of spelling rules and patterns as well as grammatical awareness.



Times Tables

During the summer term, all Year 4 children will take part in the statutory Multiplication Check. Therefore, regular practise of their times tables up to 12×12 is necessary. We will be spending a lot of time practising rapid recall of our times table facts in our maths lessons and each Friday there will be a TTRS Sound Check.

The multiplication check is 25 multiplication questions whereby the children have 6 seconds to answer using their Chromebooks. Therefore, regular practise is essential for accuracy and rapid recall of multiplication facts.

Each child has a login for TTRS which we will be using regularly within school and we would encourage you to support your child with regular practise at home.



Topics This Term

Planet Protectors (Geography)
and
The Romans (History)



This half-term we are going to look at sustainability within the world as well as the geographic location of continents and countries.

After half-term we will be studying the impact that the Romans had in Britain. We will be exploring housing, artefacts and the legacy that they left behind.

Learning at home

Spellings



- The children will be receiving a new differentiated spelling list (there will be a new spelling list every half term). Please help your child to learn their words ready for a test each week, usually on a Monday.
- The children will also be expected to learn the spelling list for Year 3/4. Please support us in helping your children learn all their spellings.

- Spelling strategies

Little and often and repetition are good ways of learning new words, Look, cover, write, check and saying words aloud. Also discussing the patterns and meanings of the words given can help give them a context. Your child can also use Spelling Shed, if you haven't got a login for this please let us know and we can set one up for you.

Learning at Home



Each week roughly 30 mins per activity should be spent on the task;

- 1 piece English, History, Science or Geography
- 1 piece Maths
- Homework will be given out on a Wednesday and handed in on the following Monday.
- Spelling lists and times tables should be learnt and revised each week.
- Reading should be done on a daily basis for a minimum of 15 minutes and signed in the reading diary. These will be collected in every week. We hope that throughout a week a child will have been heard at least 4 out of 7 times at home.
- As with our class work our expectation is that your child takes pride in their homework using pencils and homework awards are available. If your child is struggling with completing the homework task please encourage them to speak to their teacher before the weekend. We do expect all children to give their work a try to the best of their ability.
- If there isn't a reasonable reason for not completing their homework children will complete it during their lunch time.



Learning at Home Reading

Reading expands your vocabulary. The more you read, the more words you come across. The more often you read these words, the more likely you are to understand them and use them in your own writing and speaking.

- When you read with your child daily please can you sign the reading record.
- If your child reads independently can you make sure they record page numbers and if you could sign please.
- If there is a word that your child does not understand or there is a new word in their vocabulary, please write it in their reading record.
- We will be continually assessing your child's comprehension skills during individual and guided reading.

P.E Kit



All year 4 classes will have two PE sessions a week.
4BW and **4ED** will be on a **Tuesday** and **Wednesday**.
4EA will be on a **Wednesday** and **Friday**.

We ask that all children have;

- A plain white t-shirt
- Black shorts
- Appropriate footwear
- Tracksuit and sweatshirts for outdoor P.E in the chilly months!
- Earrings shouldn't be worn in P.E and the school policy doesn't allow the use of surgical tape.
- Please ensure clothing is plain and preferably non-branded.
- PE Kits should come into school on a Monday and go home on a Friday to be washed each week.
- Please ensure all P.E kit items are labelled.

Medication

- Please make sure that if your child requires medication including an inhaler in school, that it is available at all times and in date.
- Please ensure that we are aware of changes to existing conditions and that we are aware of any new ones.

Home Time

- Please make sure that you inform your class teacher if there are any changes to the normal arrangements for your child about how they will be going home, including being collected by another parent. As part of our safeguarding responsibilities, your child will not be able to go home unless you have notified us of this.
- It is your responsibility to inform Swans if your child is not attending.
- Children can only walk home alone if you have consented to this, made the Office and class teacher aware.

Absences



- Please make sure you inform the school office on the first day of absence, this is your responsibility.
- Please be aware that if your child is sick they will need to have 48 hours off since the last bout of sickness.
- Contact the office by phone or email.

Please try to ensure your child is punctual each day too as we begin work straight away each morning. There are whole class rewards for punctuality.

Please remember that the door opens at 8.35am and closes promptly at 8.45am each day.

Collection time is 3.15pm.

Please do not hesitate to speak to us if you have any concerns before then, we can then sort any issues as they arise, and work together to find the best ways to resolve them.

Enrichment opportunities

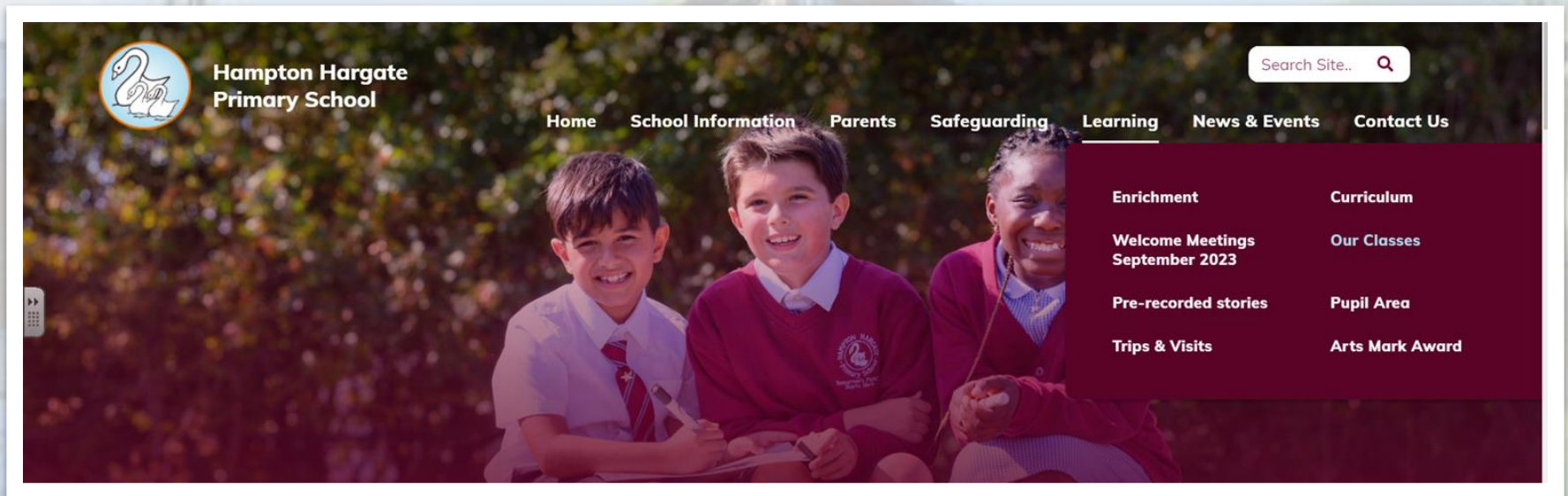
Over the year, we will have a range of exciting events and opportunities both in school and out to enrich our curriculum.
