Other reminders

Children should bring home a reading book every day.

Attendance

Attendance and punctuality are extremely important.

Cloakroom doors are open from 8.35am and close at 8.45am.

Registration takes place at 8.45am and any child arriving after this time will need to enter school through the main front entrance where they should be signed in by parent/carer.

Absence and poor punctuality impact learning.

Please help us to ensure your child gets the most out of every day in school.

Time In

If we feel that children need to reflect on their behaviour then they may be asked to go to Time In at lunchtime.

Pupils will go to the meeting room to meet a member of the teaching staff.

They will be asked to think about what happened and how they can avoid similar situations in the future.

Homework

Reading - Please encourage your children to read. Don't be shy to read to your child and listen to them read.

Spellings - Spellings are tested every FRIDAY.

Homework - Given out on a Monday to be handed in on a Friday.

Homework will support the children's preparation for Year 6 SATs.

- ✓ **If your child has difficulty with any homework tasks you are very welcome to support them and please do not hesitate to contact us for advice.**
- ✓ **There is no need for your child to spend hours on any task but they must show clear effort and time spent.**
- ✓ **Please take an interest in your child's homework. Discuss with them when they plan to do it. Ask them to tell you about it or, even better, ask them to explain how they did it! This will help to embed their understanding.**
- ✓ **Each term pupils will be given one chance to hand in homework late. Subsequently late homework will have to be completed during break/lunchtimes.**

Dealing with different abilities and SATs week

Tasks are differentiated to meet children's needs either by task or by outcome.

The children are set for Maths and Literacy lessons.

ALL children take the same SATs tests in May.

SATS week begins May 10th 2027. Children will be tested on:

- **Grammar, punctuation and spelling – two papers (Monday)**
- **Reading – one paper (Tuesday)**
- **Maths – two papers (Wednesday)**
- **Maths – one paper (Thursday)**
- **No papers on Friday**
- **Writing is teacher assessed based on the child's independent work done in regular lessons.**

Booster groups and classes.

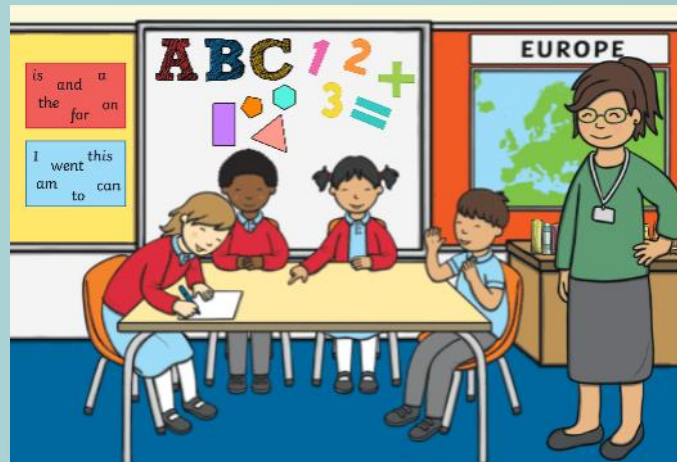
To help your child to ensure they are ready for secondary school they may well be asked to take part in booster groups at various times throughout Year 6.

This may be during school time or possibly after school.

If your child is asked to take part in these please DO NOT WORRY!

SATS Results – Published early July

Children are awarded a scaled score between 80 and 120 for each of the following:

- ✓ **Reading**
- ✓ **Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling**
- ✓ **Maths**

Scaled scores are between 80 and 120

The expected standard is 100 – this is not an average score

**Writing is teacher assessed and so no score is awarded.
Each child will be awarded one of the following:**

- **Working towards**
- **Working at the expected standard**
- **Working at greater depth**

June 21 – 23 Residential at **Caythorpe, Lincolnshire**

The total cost per child is £320.

£50 non-refundable deposit is due by September 20.

The remaining balance will need to be paid by Tuesday 2nd June 2026 and must be paid in instalments throughout the school year.

One of the most exciting things about being in Year 6 is our residential trip.

As well as the obvious physical health benefits in attending a school residential, residentials have also been proven to have a positive effect on children's self esteem and confidence levels, thereby improving their emotional health and well being.

The children will have so much fun and build many memories in their last year of Primary school.

E-safety

It is really important for you to be aware of what your child is doing online so you can support them in staying safe. Please ensure you have conversations about the apps or games or websites they like to use. **Please ensure you know what they are doing on their mobile phones.**

If you would like your child to bring a mobile phone to school they will need to ask their teacher for a permission form for you to sign.

Children MUST switch their phones OFF as they enter the school gates. We will then store their phones in our cupboards throughout the school day. Phones are to be switched on again only as they leave the school site.

Free School Meals

There will now be two categories of Free School Meals:

Targeted FSM – for families receiving Universal Credit with household earnings below £7,400 per year. These pupils will continue to attract additional funding and support for schools.

Expanded FSM – for families receiving Universal Credit with earnings above £7,400 per year. These pupils will be entitled to free meals only.

Safeguarding

Under the Education Act 2002 (section 175), schools must “make arrangements to safeguard and promote the welfare of children”. We will endeavour to provide a safe and welcoming environment where children are respected and valued.
