

## Impact of Sport Premium Funding 2017-2018

### Staff Training/CPD

- Sessions led by specialised coaches in Years 3 and 4 have supported their teaching of P.E.
- Higher skilled staff to enable high quality teaching to continue even if funding stops.
- Higher quality lessons being taught so children progress well in PE.
- Children enjoying PE and sports more, as a wide range of activities are being taught.
- Lessons meet the needs of a range of abilities and interests.

### Outside staff brought in/specialist coaches.

- Collaboration with teachers to support them and help them develop so they are more confident and skilled.
- High quality learning and enjoyment.
- Children given the chance to develop skills further in sports they are interested in, in and out of school.
- Enable children to participate in sports they might not normally get the chance to.
- PE profile raised in PE and sport throughout the school.
- Links with local sports clubs, including professional football, allowing children the chance to go and watch professionals participate in games. This generates a greater interest in games and sport.
- Greater number of children joining sports clubs or showing an interest.
- Lunchtime club has been a success and now takes place 4 days a week compared to the previous year.
- Specialist dance teacher employed.
- Closer links with Peterborough United Football Club.

### Equipment

- Children can take part in a range of skills and sports.
- Multiple lessons can take place at the same time.
- PE lessons are carried out safely, due to high quality PE equipment.
- Teachers are able to plan high quality lessons.
- Teachers/ all staff communicate with P.E co-ordinator if new resources are required.

**Summary of above:**

Increased number of children attending extra- curricular clubs led by school staff and outside agencies. A greater number and variety of sports clubs led by staff throughout the year. More children participating in sports clubs/activities not led by school. Lunchtime club a key factor in increasing numbers of children participating in sport in school. Club now takes place 4 times a week compared to twice a week.
