

## **Year 5 and 6 trip to Rutland Water**

Linking with our topic of Water for the term in Autumn 2017, the children travelled to Rutland Water for a Geography themed day out. We learned about the history of the reservoir and the reasons why it was built. The children walked across the dam and found out about how engineers monitor the quality of the water before it is pumped to homes in the region. Pupils were challenged to filter the water using a variety of equipment and we also spent time bird watching and learning about the wildlife that can be found there.
