Under the Education Act 2002 (section 175), schools must “make arrangements to safeguard and promote the welfare of children”. We will endeavour to provide a safe and welcoming environment where children are respected and valued.

- taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes

# This Term- Literacy



- In Literacy this term we are looking forward to reading and using some exciting books based on the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings to link this directly with our work in history.
- We shall be looking at a variety of text types both fiction and non-fiction, extending our understanding of their specific features and writing in the same style.
- We are continuing to focus on our children's love of reading and their comprehension skills as well as developing and extending their phonic and grammatical knowledge and use.



# This Term- Numeracy

- Extend understanding of vocabulary to then apply.
- Developing our speed and accuracy in mental calculations
- Deepening their understanding to be able to master a concept not just to be able to carry out a strategy
