We can't believe we have already come to the end of Year Three! We have had an action packed and enjoyable final term and everyone has been working very hard! Our topic this term was




"Farm to Fork." We started off by finding out all about different types of agriculture and where our food comes from. We were very interested in food




miles and used a special calculator to research how many food miles our breakfast had travelled! We also looked at what makes a healthy plate and why our bodies need a healthy and balanced diet.


